Preliminary Round

Preliminary Competition Rules & Guidelines:

1. General Information:

Total Marks: 50

Duration: 1 hour

Question Types:

A. IQ-Based Questions (30 questions, 1 mark each)

B. Short Questions (4 questions, 5 marks each)

2. Question Format & Scoring:

A. IQ-Based Questions:

Each question carries 1 mark.

Questions will test logical reasoning, analytical skills, and problem solving abilities.

B. Short Questions:

Each question carries 5 marks.

Partial credit may be awarded based on the completeness of the response.

3. Evaluation & Results:

The total score will be calculated based on correct answers. Results will be announced within a specified timeframe after evaluation.

4. Additional Guidelines:

Participants are advised to manage their time effectively. If any question appears unclear, they may seek clarification from the invigilator before the test begins.

The decision of the competition organizers will be final.

Final Round

Structure:

Two sections: Indoor and Outdoor.

Indoor: 8 questions.

Outdoor: 4 questions.

Duration: 2.5 hours.

Total Marks: $160(8 \times 10 + 4 \times 20)$

Teams must solve at least 5 Questions in the indoor round before proceeding to the outdoor round.

Participation & Submission:

Indoor Round Questions will be provided on the event website.

Answers must be submitted through the event website.

Marks Economy System:

Teams can take hints from the event website at the cost of sacrificing accumulated points.

Outdoor Challenge:

Teams must find clues throughout the campus.

Some areas will have exceptions where clues are not hidden.

Team Composition: Each team consists of 4 participants.

Additional Guidelines:

Participants are advised to manage their time effectively.

If any question appears unclear, they may seek clarification from the invigilator before the test begins.

The decision of the competition organizers will be final.
